# **Draft Annual Meeting Notes**

# May 20, 2020 via tele/web Conference Call

- 1. David Lamdin reported that pursuant to the Alumni Bylaws, Jeanne Solenski, Correspondence Secretary, sent a Notice of the Annual Membership Meeting to all active members by email and he sent to 8 members without an email address by USPS on May 10, 2020. Also, he noted that a Quorum was present to conduct business.
- 2. John Simonelli motioned that the Notes of 2019 meeting be approved as written. Second by Kevin Rose. Motion approved unanimously.
- 3. Old Business....none
- 4. Sara Durkacs, Membership Secretary, reported that there were 206 Households + 50 = 266 Total active membership

- 5. John Martine, Board Member, reported that the Lisbon tour was sold out with 34 travelers and was still on but that a final decision would be made in June in order to give folks time to purchase plane tickets.
- 6. James Russiello, Social Media Chair, reported that Victorian Society in America's Instagram has 1,200 posts and 1167 followers. As of 2018, it is shared now with the national VSA and, as of April 2020, it is shared with the VSA Summer School Committee. The admins are James Russiello, Cindy Casey, and Anne Mallek. These are fantastic numbers. The Alumni Association of the Victorian Society Summer Schools 1 Facebook Page, which was created on May 30, 2013, has 266 people like it, and 276 following it. The admins are James Russiello, Richard Guy Wilson, and David A. Lamdin, and Anne Mallek is an editor for the page. These aren't great numbers, but likely diminished since we don't create much content and all VSA news goes out through the national VSA Facebook page.
- 7. David Lamdin, Acting Treasurer, reported that as of 12/31/2019, the Alumni Assoc had a balance of \$121,701 with \$54,455 of that total being for the Buttrick Challenge.
- 8. Cindy Casey reported on the Buttrick Challenge. Through April 15, 2020, the Alumni Association has raised \$57,355 which will be matched by Jim. We have received pledges of additional support to help meet the challenge grant. We purchased a CD for \$45,000 to be earning some interest on that money until the end of 2020 when the campaign ends. We got a 7month CD with a 2.1% interest rate. We have received donations from 55 individuals as well as one donation from the Metropolitan Washington, DC Chapter. Many thanks to Sue Verzella and Sara Durkacs for helping to keep track of donations. Cindy noted that the Buttrick Challenge runs through 12/31/2020 and that donations, which must be received by 12/31/2020, are still needed to help us reach the \$100,000 goal.
- 9. David Lamdin, President, reported that the Alumni Association supported recruitment events in San Francisco and New York City as well as events for Summer Schools students in Newport and London. The president of the Alumni Association attended the VSA Board meeting in Washington, DC and the Summer School Committee (SSC) meeting in NYC. The Alumni Assoc conducted a very successful Annual Meeting in Philadelphia on May 24, 2019 with about two dozen members in attendance. In 2019, the Alumni Association continued with the digital eNewsletter replacing the paper Annual Newsletter. Great savings have been achieved by eliminating the need to purchase graphic design work, printing, and postal mailing. The eNewsletter is sent to some 750 current and former members of the Alumni Association, VSA Board members, and SSC members. The Alumni Board approved an increase in the expected donation amount for Alumni trips from \$300 to \$400. With no need for donations for 2020 scholarships, the Alumni Board decided that to help offset the losses as a result of the cancellation of the 2020 Summer Schools, it was in keeping with the mission of the Alumni Association to support the maintenance of the schools in addition to the funding of scholarships. Accordingly, the Alumni Board authorized a donation of \$16,000 to the VSA to help with the expected fixed cost of the 2020 schools. (In January 2019, the Alumni Board approved a donation of \$23,000 to the VSA for 2019 Summer School scholarships.)

- 9. Sergei Troubetzkoy offered a motion to accept all reports as delivered. The motion was seconded by Ian Berke. The motion passed unanimously.
- 10. There was no New Business.
- 11. There was a unanimous motion to adjourn which was approved unanimously.
