
So far, we have received about \$94,000 in donations to the Buttrick Challenge all of which will be matched dollar-for-dollar by Jim Buttrick to establish an endowment fund to primarily provide student scholarships to the summer schools for years to come.

For the summer schools in 2017, 2018, and 2019, the Alumni Association was able to provide about \$72,500 in scholarships to some 31 Summer Schools students who otherwise might not have been able to attend. In 2020, the Alumni Board also authorized a donation of \$16,000 to help the Summer Schools cover some of their fixed costs during this pandemic year.



Christopher Pollock (Newport 2005, London 2011, Midlands Tour 2014, and Northern Ireland Tour 2018), who is Historian in Residence for the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department, has just authored a significantly updated version of his 2001 book *San Francisco's Golden Gate Park: A Thousand and Seventeen Acres of Stories.* The 150-page book is a history of all the park's many features including buildings, meadows, lakes, gates and the like, including the cultural events that go along with them. Additionally, many sidebars address various aspects of contextual background and related facets. The book was released this past summer by San Francisco based publisher Norfolk Press.



In a Nov. 7, 2020 article in the *New York Times* reporting on the long-planned renovation of the sunken plaza and the underground shopping concourse surrounding it, **Sibyl McCormac Groff** (London 1982 and Newport 2005), known for her <u>Christmastime tours around Rockefeller Center</u>, said she did not fault its owners. "Sometimes we have to do these things to move forward," she said. Ms. Groff even suggested that the pandemic might be a good time to get the work done, since the number of visitors is down. "And hopefully the tourists will come back."
