As the Alumni Association enters its 2022 membership renewal season, the Board of Directors has decided to reduce the membership fee for 2022 to \$25. Of course, it is the hope that all current members will be able to renew their 2022 memberships in the Alumni Association. With the continuing averse economic impact of the virus, we do not want to lose any potential renewals because the membership fee is too high. In addition, we plan to reach out to alumni who have not been active members for the past few years and hope to encourage their renewed membership with the reduced membership fee.

As you may know, the Alumni Association has no paid staff. Membership fees are used to cover the administrative expenses. The balance of the membership fee is used for Summer School Scholarships.

Many members donate over and above the basic membership fee to help fully fund the scholarship requirements. Because of our members and generous donors, we have been able to provide well over \$20,000 in scholarships each year for many years. With your renewed membership and support together with our recently established Endowment Fund, we hope to be able to continue to offer scholarship assistance to potential student so that none are precluded from attending the Summer Schools because of lack of sufficient funds to pay the full tuition.







Warren Ashworth (Newport 2009 and Chicago 2015) in collaboration with his wife has written a book of historical fiction which will be published this fall. The protagonist is a Victorian house in Kansas and the other protagonist is an early-nineteenth-century portrait. Details of the publication will be provided as soon as they become available.

We, the House begins in 1878 in a frontier town on the Kansas prairie where a battered Civil War Union veteran builds his new wife her dream house, an Italianate glory she names Ambleside. Soon an early American portrait of Mrs. Simon Peale arrives from Hartford, Connecticut to dignify the dining room wall. When the portrait's existential yelp causes house and painting to discover each other, Ambleside is a perfect 'tabula rasa,' almost literally born yesterday, and Mrs. Peale is a devastated young widow, a starchy professor of Latin, who has been dead since 1841. Together, through the lives and generations of 'their' family, this disarming odd couple witness and try to comprehend the panorama of American social history—from women's suffrage, three wars, the ice box, photography, and the invention of the two-byfour, to indoor plumbing and electrification, the Dust Bowl, the Depression, and Dachau, foxglove, the Love That Dare Not Speak its Name, the song of the catbird, and Little Women. Over the decades, a most unusual love develops between them and quietly deepens, until one day in 2010 an art historian from New York happens to see the portrait of Mrs. Peale and, abruptly, everything changes.
