HOW TO APPLY

GENERAL INFORMATION

All three programs are open to graduate students, academics, architects, and knowledgeable enthusiasts. The Summer Schools are academically rigorous and physically demanding. A typical day includes lecture and tours by leading scholars, considerable walking, periods of standing, and engaging in social experiences. These intensive programs are action packed, with little free time. Tuition costs include all accommodation, expert instruction, some meals, tours, and admissions.

All program accommodation offered is for single en suite, save for Newport which uses a dormitory with shared bathrooms. In Newport, self-paying (non-scholarship) participants not wishing to stay in the dormitory are welcome to arrange alternative accommodations at their own expense, and would be offered an adjusted tuition rate. Day rates are also available for local residents participating in the Chicago and London programs.



Join renowned architectural historian Richard Guy Wilson for his 43rd and final year as director of the Newport Summer School!

Experience and study four centuries of architecture, art, culture, and landscape in the "Queen" of American resorts, with lectures by leading scholars, tours of private homes, and opportunities to get behind the scenes at some of America's grandest mansions.

The Chicago Summer School focuses on the American roots of Modernism, and Chicago in the later 19th century as a city at the forefront of technological and aesthetic experimentation.

Visits will include H. H. Richardson's Glessner House, Adler & Sullivan's Auditorium Theatre Building, Burnham & Root's Rookery Building, Oak Park, and America's first planned industrial community of Pullman. Now entering its 49th year, the London Summer School is a two-week program that surveys the history of British architecture, design and interiors from 1837-1914.

The program crosses the country, visiting historic buildings and museum collections across London, exploring England's industrial heritage in Birmingham, Liverpool and Manchester, as well as the flowering of the English Arts and Crafts Movement in the Cotswolds, Oxford and Surrey.
